

Learning

Elements of learning to read and write independently:

Phonics

- Revision of all letters of the alphabet in September.
- Using these to blend three, then four letter words.
- Knowing when to use medial vowels
 e.g. a: cat, sat -o: cot, top (October/November)
- Using digraph sounds e.g. 'ai', 'oa', 'ee', 'or' to form words (December – June)





High Frequency Words

These are the most commonly used words in our language. We encourage the children with a 'say and see' approach to these rather than sounding out. (Some are tricky words that can't be sounded out.)

- Revision of reading the first 50 words learned in P1 (September/October)
- 2-3 new words each week so that by end of year the children should recognise the first 100 words.
- Weekly work in class on forming words using playdough, tracing them in sand, chalk in playground etc.

Reading

Please listen to your child reading and talk about the book every night. Continue to revise sounds in sound books and look over word cards.

Pupils are assessed in September to establish their reading level and to formulate reading groups. Ongoing reading and Phonic assessment are carried out throughout the year and reading groups may be re-organized

Reading Schemes:

<u>**Oxford Reading Tree</u>**: Reinforces high frequency words learned from word cards.</u>

Dandelion Launchers/Songbirds/Bug Club: Help children to blend using the phonics they have learned in school.

<u>Big Cat</u>: Non fiction books help children to see that books have different genres and to learn facts.

Pupils read in class with the teacher on Mon – Thurs.

Using Phonics to decode words, comprehension skills and identifying grammar points are incorporated into each reading session.

Pupils complete a comprehension activity in class each week. This is used an informal way of assessing their understanding of the text.

Writing


Each week the children will be encouraged to be as independent as possible during writing, using the words they have learned or can sound out. They use word walls to help with unknown words and try to sound out others. There are different opportunities for writing throughout the week:



- Weekend News books (Monday)
- Simple dictated sentences using most common words and sounded out words e.g. I can see the big dog.
- Writing forms (Friday) This introduces the children to writing e.g. letters, simple poems, instructions, stories, in speech bubbles etc. Often the teacher demonstrates this first, then the children are encouraged to have a go.

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The child will have a good attempt at sounding out some words. We don't fix/ mark these wrong unless it is very difficult to read.





Spellings

From late October, the P2s will receive weekly spelling lists. Initially these will focus on the middle vowel sounds e.g. Week 1 – fan, man, map Week 2 – bed, pen, ten There will also be one common word to learn e.g. the, of

The children will progress to four common words each week and two using their phonic sounds from that week. E.g. in, my, went, at, **chip, chat**

Please look over these each evening as part of daily homework. These are tested every Friday.

You will notice a lot of the common word spellings will be repeated throughout the year. This is to really consolidate these as they can be tricky to retain.

- Learn number bonds to 10 using a variety of practical resources.
- Count up to and recognise numbers to 30. Count in twos, fives and tens to 50.
- Recognise coins up to £1.00. Solve problems using money up to 10p, progressing to 20p.
- Solve simple problems involving addition and subtraction to 10, progressing towards 20.

Time and Measures

- Order days of the week and months.
 Discuss seasons and daily timetable.
 Introduction to 'O'clock' times.
- Weight, Capacity and Length – Introduce measuring/weighing with everyday objects e.g. cubes and straws.
- Investigate measures through Play Based Learning


Shape, Position and Movement

- Make patterns using everyday objects and shapes.
- Use 2D and 3D shapes during play. Introduce names of 3D shapes and revise main 2D shapes.
- Use Beebots to move forwards, backwards, left and right.

- Venn, Carroll and Tree Diagrams




